Summer at Fairhill helps students achieve and develop academic skills in the areas of language arts, math, executive function, mental and physical wellness, fine arts, and more.

LANGUAGE THERAPY CODE BREAKERS

Grades 1-6

Cracking the code for reading and writing

This summer language therapy class, led by a certified academic language therapist (CALT), is designed to support elementary school students with dyslexia or other language-based learning difficulties. Through engaging, multisensory activities, students will work on improving reading, spelling, and writing skills in a fun and supportive environment. The class focuses on building foundational language skills, boosting confidence, and providing individualized strategies to help students overcome challenges. With a small-group setting, each child receives personalized attention and instruction tailored to their needs.

READING ENRICHMENT READING RANGERS

Grades 1-4

Discovering adventure between the pages!

Students increase comprehension skills, fluency, sight words, and vocabulary. Students are introduced to the elements of a story utilizing a variety of genres. Guided activities and discussions help students analyze text, make connections and share ideas. Age appropriate fiction and non-fiction materials are utilized.

READING ENRICHMENT BEYOND THE PAGE

Grades 5-8

Where reading meets strategy

This course helps students strengthen fluency, vocabulary and comprehension. Students will learn how to identify main ideas, make inferences, expand vocabulary and increase understanding. Through guided practice and interactive discussion students build consistent reading routines and critical thinking skills. Age appropriate fiction and non-fiction materials are utilized.

WRITING WORKSHOP 1

Grades 1-4

In this course, young writers will develop fundamental writing skills as they create, write and illustrate their own books. Students will practice letter formation, segmenting sounds to spell words, identifying parts of speech and analyzing sentence construction. Students will discover the joy of storytelling with the hands on multi-sensory activities in this class.

WRITING WORKSHOP 2

Grades 5-6

These intermediate writers learn the steps of the writing process by writing paragraphs, essays, reports and poetry. Emphasis is on grammar, structure and using clear concise language. Students will revise, edit, and refine their work, creating polished writing pieces they can use as models for future projects.

WRITING WITH A PURPOSE

Grades 7-8

This course helps middle school students strengthen their writing skills by learning how to write with clear purpose and organization. Students practice idea development with supporting details, and structuring paragraphs effectively. Through guided instruction and engaging writing activities, students become more confident and thoughtful writers.

MATH ENRICHMENT

Grades 1-4

This course emphasizes active student participation as math concepts are explored through the use of manipulative materials. Games and activities are used to reinforce computation skills, numerical concepts and expand problem-solving skills. The purpose of the course is to strengthen math skills with fun activities and opportunities for success.

MATH APPLICATIONS

Grades 5-6

This is a “hands-on” session examining number relations, computation, fraction and decimal concepts and problem-solving skills. The class emphasizes cooperative learning through investigation. Concept development, computation skills and algebraic thinking are integrated into class work with the aid of interactive whiteboard technology and multi-media presentations.

ALGEBRA READINESS

Grades 7-8

This interactive, hands-on course strengthens essential pre-algebra foundations. Students will deepen their understanding of number relationships, fractions, integers, algebraic expressions, equations, and graphing. Through guided instruction and engaging activities, students build critical thinking skills and reinforce the core concepts needed for success in upper-level math.



LEARNING STRATEGIES

Grades 7-8

This course helps students entering grades 5-8 develop essential learning strategies to boost confidence and academic success. Students will practice effective study methods such as note-taking, active reading, and test preparation while also strengthening executive functioning skills like time management, organization, and goal setting. They will learn how to break tasks into manageable steps, stay focused, and advocate for their own learning needs. Through engaging activities, students will build the skills needed to become independent, motivated learners.

LEADERSHIP AND SOCIAL SKILLS

Grades 5-8

Don't get lost in the crowd! Lack of confidence, peer pressure, and low self-esteem are just a few factors that can affect the way that others see and react to us. This program will focus on leadership and social skills that can be used from the classroom to the sports field. Class activities will include interactive games, class presentations and social gatherings.



DRAMA CAMP

This fun and engaging theatre camp introduces students to the world of acting while building confidence, creativity, and teamwork. Through activities like improvisation, scene work, and characterization games, students will develop their on-stage presence in a supportive environment. The camp emphasizes communication and collaboration, allowing students to take risks, express themselves, and build friendships. The week will conclude with a final group performance, where all campers showcase their newfound skills for an audience.

SPORTS CAMPS

Fairhill School is hosting a sports camp that's perfect for both middle school and elementary students! For middle schoolers, the focus will be on team-building activities that foster communication, leadership, and collaboration. Elementary campers will have a blast learning and developing new skills in a variety of sports, all while building confidence and teamwork in a fun, supportive environment.

ARTS CAMP

Young Picasso's Arts Camp for students Entering Grades 1-5. Enroll your child in a week long class of hands-on visual arts. They will explore a variety of materials and techniques, including clay, painting, and printmaking.


Clay Exploration for students entering Grades 6-8. This class teaches all of the basic handbuilding techniques: pinch pot, coil, slab and sculptural. Each student will receive enough guidance to successfully complete the project and enough autonomy to creatively bloom. Students will also have the opportunity to make a wheel-thrown pot.

CHESS CAMP

Learning to play chess encourages patience, memory, concentration, problem solving and an understanding of consequences. It requires students to break down a problem and then put it back together. Chess improves decision-making, increases self-confidence and develops organizational habits.

STEM CAMP

Our STEM camp for middle schoolers offers an exciting, hands-on exploration of science, technology, engineering, and math, with a special focus on rocketry! Campers will design, build, and launch their own rockets while learning the principles of aerodynamics, physics, and engineering. Through interactive experiments and teamwork, students will develop problem-solving skills and a passion for innovation, making STEM learning both fun and engaging.



HIGH SCHOOL



Credit Courses

Entering Grades 9-12
June 1st- 26th

Daily Class Time 8:00 am– 3:30 pm

Fairhill School is accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools. Credits are transferable and meet graduation requirements for the state of Texas. Small structured classes allow each student individual attention in each course.

To obtain credit for both semesters of a course, students need to register for all four weeks. One-half credit is granted for each semester course. The fee for each 1/2 credit course is \$750.

To have grades/credits transferred to another school, please reach out to Mrs. Lewis to complete the records request information.

GOVERNMENT

The government curriculum consists of studies of various forms of foreign governments, the fundamentals of the United States government, the establishment of political parties, the roles of key figures, taxes, the powers of Congress, the constitution, and amendments. Local and national periodicals provide topics for class discussion and debate, while weekly current event assignments encourage independent research of the topics affecting and influencing our government today.

ECONOMICS


Economics is a one-semester course that covers information in the areas of economic systems, business organizations, supply and demand, the Stock Market, competition, market failures, bankruptcies, microeconomics, and macroeconomics. Periodicals provide topics for class discussion and debate, and students keep a notebook of current event news stories as a weekly assignment

SPEECH

The speech curriculum emphasizes the correct diction and use of gestures in expressive speech. Students practice different styles of speech delivery, such as informative, persuasive, and impromptu, and they present their work on a weekly basis. Additional study focuses on famous speeches from recorded history and the Right of Free Speech as presented in the US Constitution, while memorization of the Gettysburg Address aids as a tool to perfect diction and projection.

HEALTH

The health course provides students with accurate information which they can use to develop healthy attitudes and behavior patterns. Students are encouraged to recognize their role in choosing healthy behaviors in order to reduce risks. Topics covered include mental health, family and social health, human growth and development, nutrition, fitness, substance abuse, diseases and disorders, consumer and personal health, safety, and environmental health.



SUMMER PROGRAM POLICIES



REGISTRATION

Enrollment is open to students entering grades 1-12. Students need to have average intellectual ability with no primary emotional, social, or behavioral disorders.

Please complete the enrollment agreement with submittal of a non-refundable deposit of \$200.

Enrollment deadlines:
Elementary/Middle: May 8th
High School: May 15th

TUITION & FEES

All fees must be paid in full by the 1st day of class. The non-refundable deposit of \$200 is applied to total fee.

Academic enrichment courses are \$800.00 (3 weeks) and 1 week afternoon camps are \$300.00 per week.

Full day sessions, the Ultimate Summer package is \$1,600.

REFUND POLICY

Fairhill School reserves the right to limit, cancel or consolidate classes without prior notice. Class fee refunds, including the non-refundable deposit of \$200, will be given only if a class is cancelled or does not meet minimum enrollment. No refund will be given for a student who withdraws or is dismissed from the summer classes after the program has begun.

LUNCH

If attending all day sessions please pack a mid-morning snack, lunch, and water bottle.

DRESS CODE

Dress code for the summer program is casual, however all students need to wear athletic shoes (no flip flops, crocs or sandals). Fairhill reserves the right to dismiss any student dressed inappropriately.

TRANSPORTATION

All Elementary & Middle School Students participating in early drop-off, may be dropped off at 7:50 am, in carpool.

If only attending afternoon camps, please drop students off no earlier than 12:20 pm.

All students must be picked up no later than 15 minutes after last session.
